Setup & Cleanup: Setup will take place Fri, July 12 beginning at 5:30pm. Chicken dinner is served after setup along with birthday cake for our 200-year anniversary. We will also bless our new bicentennial monument that will be placed in front of church. All are welcome. Booth assembly and finishing touches will take place

Saturday morning. Clean up will take place throughout the day starting at 8am on Mon, July 15.

Dedicating Bicentennial Monument: After set-up on Friday evening, at Approx 8pm, we will bless our new bicentennial monument that is placed in front of church and serve cake.

St. Martin – July 27 /28 :

St Paul – August 10 /11 :

Desserts: Each family is asked to donate 3 pies or cakes for the dinners (pies are preferred). Desserts can be dropped off Saturday or Sunday beginning at 7am. Extra desserts are needed for the Saturday evening Pork Loin Dinner. Cookies, brownies, cakes, etc are appreciated for Saturday.

Setup: Mon, Aug 5 at 6pm ~ set up tents/ start building stands. Clean the kitchen and set up the hall. Tue, Aug 6 through Fri, Aug 9 ~ continue festival setup. Sat, Aug 10 ~ final setup, clean vegetables. Mon, August 12~ all day cleanup
