Ars Cafe & Meeting House Purpose Statement

The purpose of this coffee ministry is to create a non-threatening place of radical welcome where people are treated with dignity and respect. A place where the Gospel is preached through actions, more than words, but a place where Bible studies, small groups, deep conversations, laughter and joy reign!

How it Works

Ars Cafe and Meeting House is a ministry of the parish guided by:

- Parish and Finance Councils
- Ars sub committee- composed of 10 members
- Ars paid staff and volunteers

Finances

- Our start up costs were over \$211,000 (\$116,000 in donations to offset this)
- In our first year of ministry, like many new ministries, we lost \$40,000.
- In our second year of ministry we profited \$6,500.00 and are still in the black this new fiscal year.

Staffing

- 1 part-time operations manager (we began with a full-time manager)
- 13 part-time employees (ranging from teens to young adults)
- Various Volunteers
- Open 7 days a week for 60 hours (20 more hours than our parish office)

We are a Cafe and a Meeting House

- We host rentals; birthdays, baptism parties, bridal showers and other events.
- We host community events; Public School Art Show, Committee and Board Meetings, Young Adult groups, bible studies, knitting clubs, craft events, youth ministry, etc.

 We serve a lot more than coffee. We also offer a full menu of food and treats from made to order breakfast and lunch sandwiches, soups, and pastries.

- "We were fortunate to have two different baby showers, both of which were hosted at Ars. Additionally, we gathered around 40 friends and family members at Ars to celebrate the baptism of our son! We were able to provide food and drink from Ars and everyone had nothing but amazing things to say about the entire experience!"
- "We love Ars as a place to meet after Daily Mass. We discuss the readings and the scriptures over a great cup of coffee. There was not a place to meet but now we have a home."
- "We regularly go to Ars on Sundays after Mass and often see the same parishioners coming from the same Mass. We have had the opportunity to spend some time getting to know them which is extremely important for us because we are not originally from this area. We have had the chance to get to know many others in the parish community! Without a narthex on our churches, Ars is perfect."
- "We are from Bright Christian Church. We are men who have been meeting for more than 20 years. We used to meet at your church until Ars opened. We like Ars because it's quiet, inviting, centrally located in relation to our homes, and we like the coffee and pastries. We often see others from our church visiting Ars who are not associated with our bible study group. Having a public place to have a bible study is evangelization itself."



Advancing the Eucharistic Revival

The three-year Eucharistic Revival of the Church in the United States, which began on Corpus Christi 2022. Initiated by Bishop Robert Barron and led by Bishop Andrew Cozzens, the Revival has aimed to:

- Reinvigorate the worship of God at Mass.
- Foster personal encounters with Jesus in Eucharistic adoration.
- Deepen knowledge of Eucharistic faith.
- Inspire living and sharing the faith through charity and mission.

Fruits of the Revival:

- Mass attendance has rebounded to pre-COVID levels, with notable growth in RCIA/OCIA programs, especially on college campuses.
- Eucharistic adoration and processions have surged, drawing young Catholics and communities nationwide.
- The National Eucharistic Congress (2024) and the historic National Eucharistic Pilgrimage united tens of thousands in a public witness of Eucharistic faith.

While the formal initiative concludes, the mission continues. Every Mass, Holy Hour, Communion, and act of Eucharistic devotion renews the Church: "The Church is always brought to life anew by the Eucharistic Jesus."

Next Steps:

- Give thanks for the graces of the Revival.
- Make it personal: grow in Eucharistic faith, love, and amazement.
- Build on the pillars: enhance reverence at Mass, expand adoration, and share the joy
 of the Eucharist with others.
